

## **RE Official Information Act request WCDHB 9346**

- 1. The number of schools offering the vaccine over the past ten years
- 2. The number of women who received the vaccine in schools over the past ten years
- 3. The number of women who received the vaccine outside of schools over the past ten years

## Notes:

- 1. The number of schools on the West Coast has declined over this timeframe due to school closures / merges.
- 2. We have one large school at Gloriavale, who does not vaccinate. With low numbers of students on the West Coast, small numbers not being vaccinated have a disproportionate affect on our immunisation rates.
- 3. From 2018, Primary Practices started giving HPV with the 11 year old vaccination i.e. Tetanus; at the same time the School Based Programme started giving missed 11 year vaccinations with the HPV vaccination.
