The target is everyone needing radiation treatment will have this within within four weeks by January 2011. Six regional oncology centres provide radiation oncology services. These centres are in Auckland. Hamilton, Palmerston North, Wellington, Christchurch and Dunedin.

The change from previous quarter has been calculated using quarter two four-week waiting times. All DHBs have met the previous six-week target. Both results are displayed above.
