
Immunisation

Better diabetes and cardiovascular services

This graph represents the average progress made by a DHB towards three target indicators:

- 90 percent of the eligible adult population will have had their cardiovascular disease risk assessed in the last five years;
- an increased percent of people with diabetes will attend free annual checks;
- an increased percent of people with diabetes will have satisfactory or better diabetes management.
