Primary Care Physiotherapist

Te Nīkau Health Centre's Primary Care Physiotherapy role is a pilot position. If the pilot is successful, the role may become permanent and be expanded to other sites.

What to expect

Expert Physiotherapy assessment, diagnosis, advice and management for anyone with new injuries or long-term bone, muscle, joint, neck or back pain or associated symptoms. If required, referrals to other services, for example, radiology, orthopaedics and laboratory are available.

The Primary Care Physiotherapist is not available for ongoing or long-term treatment and rehabilitation. Patients requiring these services will be referred to the appropriate service.

Referral source

Self-referrals to the Primary Care Physiotherapist are encouraged. Referrals will also be accepted from other sources.

What is the cost?

It is the same as seeing a GP or Nurse Practitioner. There are different fees for enrolled and casual patients. The full Te Whatu Ora West Coast GP fee schedule is available on our website – wcdhb.health. nz
